#### FROM OUR PASTOR

#### PASTORAL STAFF

Dear Friends,

There are times in our lives that are reflective times: new years, new beginnings, milestone birthdays, anniversaries and major life events. One exercise that helps reflection is to remember how God has touched your life—where and how, who and when God has especially visited and been with us in the stages and times of our life.

This weekend marks the 40th anniversary of my ordination to priesthood on June II, 1977. There were notable times before then that were crucial—my experience of God's call, not really knowing what that meant at the time, the where and how God was calling me to respond—but in every bit as real a way, I remember (how) God has touched me and led me along the way since ordination.

One thing clear to me is the truth of the saying "God writes straight with crooked lines." We think we know what we want to do and the reasons why we want to do it, but, somehow, God's plan finds a way to emerge. Maybe we shouldn't be so surprised.

One of the reasons I didn't join the Jesuits was that I did not believe I wanted to teach. Yet, during my deacon internship I had a great experience teaching in the parish school's junior high. When I met with the rector of the seminary about my evaluation that said, "Tom would make a great teacher." I insisted that Fr. Al Bischoff, my supervisor, meant to say preacher instead. Then the personnel director called me and said, "I hope this doesn't send you into any kind of depression, but you are teaching at Moeller." God had His way. Still, I thought I'd do the 3–5 year term I was sentenced to, then would go about my plan for ministry. But, I fell in love with teaching and education, returned to school to get the necessary background to be competent and credible, and spent 19 years in secondary education. That was a blessing and I was blessed through it all. Now as a pastor, I wanted to be in a parish with a Catholic school.

As a high school assistant principal and principal, I was blessed with the training and experience that often transferred to pastoral ministry and certainly pastoral leadership.

Through all these years, I have been so blessed to work with tremendous people, people of faith who committed themselves to share the Lord with others. My first meeting with the Principal at Moeller, Fr. Krusling, was abruptly interrupted by the Athletic Director, Gerry Faust, coming in shouting, "We need a priest in the locker room!" in his own hoarse, gravel voice. That began my coaching career. He made my job as head of the Religion Department so much easier because he was not only a great role model and devout believer, but he also encouraged prayer. I could tell such stories about every place I have served.

Just as inspiring has been my experience of the people of God everywhere. How good people are! In the midst of all their trials, crises and tragedies, the belief of God's people has been an ongoing inspiration.

Thank you for being an inspiration for me. You are such blessings! May God bless you as God continues to bless me through you.

It will be a great help knowing when you will be attending this session. We encourage you to come during the 7th or 8th month of pregnancy, if at all possible.



#### **ACT Prep Class**

An ACT Prep class will be held at IHM on Monday, June 19 (6–9 p.m.) and Tuesday, June 20 (9–3 p.m.). Kati Johnson of ACTmom.org will be teaching students the structure and content of the test using only real ACT tests. Students will develop a personal strategy for each of the four sections. In turn, they will become proficient in recognizing correct answer choices and avoiding wrong ones. Students will create a long term study plan that includes instruction, practice, correction, and assessment.

Many students improve their cumulative score 2 to 4 points after participating in a study group and following through on a study plan. This 15 hour program consists of 8 hours of instruction and 7 hours of homework.

And it is the support of a huge number of you IHM parishioners and the inspiration of the Holy Spirit that allows me to enter one of those prisons. So it is with the most sincere gratitude that I once again salute you. Your financial support, the home-baked cookies, the decorated bags, placemats and posters, and oh, so many prayers carried me again across the threshold of Lucasville Prison for a Kairos Retreat the end of April. Every one of you entered that place with me through your emotional, spiritual and prayerful support. I can't even find the words to thank you enough. As always the 30 residents were amazed and enormously grateful for this outflowing of Agape Love.

The 4 days plus a follow-up Saturday all went smoothly. I was blessed to be the Table Leader for the "Family of Matthew" with six residents and two other volunteers. The men get some opportunities to share their own thoughts, especially at the closing ceremony. I'll choose just one man's remarks and paraphrase. Melvin was incarcerated at age 21 and has been in 11 years with two to serve. His was a non-violent offense. He was from our area. He was a Freemason. He came to Kairos curious, looking for guidance, advice, enlightenment. He saw brothers moved by the Volunteer's stories, by the outpouring of love and support in their letters (all 35 volunteers write a letter for each of the 30 residents), he was touched. He said on several occasions this experience taught him that the stereotype that Inmates think "outsiders" have of them is not valid, there are people who care, who can forgive and love them. He finished with this, "Jesus is the way to the light, and let the brothers receive the light." Did we help Melvin; did we get him to or near the mountaintop? We can only hope Melvin walks with Jesus in that light now. Melvin was killed by another Inmate on May 2. There can be no greater sign of the importance/value of practicing the Works of Mercy and praise to every one of you for withholding judgment, entertaining forgiveness and supporting this ministry. Please pray for all victims and perpetrators.

My name is Kelsey Overley. I have been selected to be the first member of IHM to be a Friends of Batahola Volunteer for our twinning community, the Cultural Center of Batahola Norte in Managua, Nicaragua. I have been working toward this opportunity since I first visited the Center with Sue Keefe's IHM group in 2011. To make this happen, I need your help!

For the past 10 years the sending organization, VMM (Volunteer Missionary Movement), has helped support the volunteers. Unfortunately, that organization will be closing their doors after the current volunteer leaves in August. The program normally provides the volunteers with health insurance, financial support, air fare to Managua, etc. The Friends of Batahola also supports the volunteers by paying a portion of their rent and some other housing expenses. While the Friends of Batahola and CCBN are looking for a new sending organization I will be going as an independent Friends of Batahola volunteer. To continue the volunteer program without the benefit of a sending organization, I will need help from outside of that support system.

# Filled with the presence of God

Picture in your mind your favorite painting or photograph. Hear the familiar sounds of the recording you most enjoy. Think of your favorite movie, the background of its setting, the soundtrack, lighting and costumes.

In each, what is not seen or heard is essential to our experience of that which is central. A painting, without the color or light in the background would have no clear image upon which to gaze; music without the pauses, an endless stream of noise; a movie without the background falls flat, and does not capture our attention. This could be one way of thinking about the Holy Spirit in our lives. People sometimes say they have a difficult time perceiving the Holy Spirit, and yet, the presence of the Holy Spirit within us is like the background in a painting that allows the image to shine through: as people created in God's image and likeness, it is the power of the Holy Spirit that infuses us with the gifts, guidance, wisdom, and courage to live as Christian disciples and stewards. We often only recognize the Spirit's presence in hindsight, much as we only recognize the background in the movie as we reflect on it over time.

Once we draw our attention to the unseen and yet holy within and around us, we recognize the Spirit's action in our minds and hearts, and we perceive the presence of God in others. We see the eyes of Christ in the eyes of the poor and the lonely; we hear the voice of the Lord in the call of a child or an elder; and we become ready to witness to the love of God in the course of our daily lives. We share our presence, gifts, and resources as stewards through the power of the Holy Spirit, grateful people whose lives are filled with the presence of God.

We begin and end prayer with the Sign of the Cross, but have you ever thought of the sign itself as a prayer?

The Sign of the

Cross invites us into an encounter with God's love, protection, mercy, forgiveness and presence. Through this briefest of prayers, we recall the key mysteries of our faith:

that we are created in love and for love by God the Father; we are redeemed through Jesus Christ, whose passion, death, and resurrection lead us to the fullness of life; and we are filled with the Holy Spirit, whose presence empowers us to live as God desires. These three persons are one God, whose love is overflowing, everlasting, abundant beyond our comprehension.

The Sign of the Cross is a sign of our faith, whether prayed privately in personal prayer or publicly, before meals, at Mass, with friends.

For many, this is what has happened to the gifts of the Holy Spirit, which were poured out upon us at Confirmation. We have received the gifts, yet they remain unused and underappreciated. Some of us may not even remember what the gifts are, and yet, they are with us always. We could say these are gifts that really do "keep on giving."

Wisdom. Understanding. Right Judgment. Courage. Knowledge. Reverence. Wonder and Awe. Who doesn't need these gifts in our lives? Think of the impact the gifts could have in relationships with family and friends, in sticky situations at work, the difference these gifts could make in our world! We may not always be aware of it, but the Holy Spirit is with and within us. Please don't wait to open these gifts!
