Dear IHM Parishioners,

In our Archdiocese there has long been a commitment by our Bishops and Archbishops to provide financial support for our catholic schools located in economically depressed neighborhoods. This organization called CISE (Catholic Inner-City Education Fund) was established in 1980 by Archbishop Joseph Bernardin.

Now 38 years later, there are over 1800 students currently attending these schools. They not only offer an outstanding Catholic education but also meet basic needs by providing breakfast, hot lunch and power packs for the weekends. All of this happens in an environment of faith, safety and respect.

For many years, IHM has been a strong supporter of CISE. It takes about 3 million dollars a year to underwrite these programs. In addition, a High School foundation has been established which helps these students to finish their education in our Catholic High Schools.

IHM has not only been a wonderful supporter of these programs, but some of our members have served on the CISE Board. Bob Hodge has chaired the Board for many years, Deacon Mike Cassani is a new member and Pat Armstrong is both a board member and the former Assistant Superintendent to these schools. We've seen and heard what these wonderful schools achieve. The collection is this weekend. Thank you for your past support. Any financial support you offer will make a huge difference in the lives of many children.
