New Pyx Procedure

As mentioned in a previous bulletin, Archbishop Schnurr has asked parishes to implement a new practice of distributing Holy Communion to those who will be visiting and ministering to the homebound and those otherwise unable to attend Mass. We will be implementing the following procedure January 26 & 27, 2019.

For those who take Holy Communion to nursing homes and care facilities throughout the week, there really is no change. When you are scheduled to minister, you can stop by Church and retrieve the number of hosts that you need from the Tabernacle.

For those who will be taking Holy Communion directly after Mass, please note:

- when you arrive for Mass, unconsecrated hosts will be available in the Minister's Sacristy. Please fill your pyx with the number that you need.
- once you have filled your pyx, place it on the Gift Table in the Gathering Space to be carried forward during the Offertory Procession.
- As the gifts are brought forward, the pyx will be placed on the Altar for consecration just like the hosts those present will receive.
- Following the Distribution of Holy Communion, those visiting the sick and homebound will be called forward to receive their pyx. Once you have received your pyx, you may return to your seat for the Final Blessing and Dismissal.

Important Reminder...as you are transporting the Body of Christ, it is important that once you leave Mass you go as directly as possible to the facility where you will be distributing Holy Communion. It is not appropriate to run errands or complete other tasks while you are in possession of the Body of Christ.

This new procedure allows the community gathered for Mass to remember our call to care for those who cannot be with us and to pray for you as you exercise your ministry. Thank you for taking Our Lord to those unable to attend.

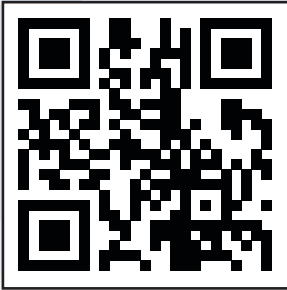

Gathered and Sent

In the life of the Church, the community is "gathered" for worship, word and Eucharist and is "sent" to spread the Gospel message. Included is a short reflection on these topics to remind us of the Dismissal Rite announced by the Deacon at the end of the Mass. In a metaphorical sense think of "Gathered and Sent" as the breath (inhale and exhale) of the Spirit of Christ living in the Church.

Gathered

She (the Church) exists in local communities and is made real as a liturgical, above all a Eucharistic assembly. (CCC 752)

Sent

Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord. Reading the scriptures also makes it clear that the Gospel is not merely about our personal relationship with God...The Gospel is about the Kingdom of God. (Joy of the Gospel 180)
