### FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

It is hard to express what a great experience my sabbatical was. This was true on many levels.

At the very start, at our first gathering in January, this statement was made: "The Church is much more than my experience of it." I appreciated that insight. We can also apply that description to many things—to people, to God, for example.

We know the Church is universal and we only experience a certain part of that universality through our personal encounters. One of the great blessings of the sabbatical program at the School of Applied Theology was its great diversity which gave a broad experience through the many varied backgrounds of its participants.

Our roster of brothers, sisters and priests on sabbatical included:

- Bro. Andrew, a Christian Brother and missionary from Sierra Leone in Africa,
- Fr. Pat, an Irish Passionist priest, serving in Northern Ireland,
- Sr. Rita, a nun form England who served in various stations in Europe,
- Sr. Leonarda, a nun from Cameroon in Africa, who directed a physical rehabilitation center ministry,
- Fr. Mike, a priest from the Philippines who had done missionary work in Africa, before his time in Rome with his order's administration,
- Sr. Kesta, a nun from Haiti, who spent the previous 12 years in Montreal, Canada as the Superior General of her order,
- Sr. Augustine, a nun from Nigeria, who served in educational ministries with her first book being published during our time on sabbatical,
- Fr. Chris, a Marianist priest, who had served in Mexico and San Antonio,
- Fr. Francisco, a priest from Mexico who will be ministering to a Hispanic community in Southern California,
- Sr. Terry, a nun from Ireland and Fr. Abe, a priest from Ireland, were late arrivals due to illness and finishing his particular assignment,
- Fr. Gerry, a missionary from the Philippines, who had also served in other countries,
- And me!

Our small group represented four continents and multiple countries and cultures with perspectives enriched by all those backgrounds. "The Church is much more than my experience of it."

My sabbatical time was such a blessing—sharing with these fellow ministers, having the opportunity to take a step back from the day to day and not miss the big picture. As well, it was an opportunity to take time for an interior pilgrimage, with the assistance of Ignatian and Franciscan spiritual direction. Finally, there were many recreational opportunities I took part in—museums, sightseeing and a Napa Valley "educational" tour through a winery.

I want to thank Fr. Tony, Fr. Pat and our staff who continued the great work of IHM ministry to God's people.

I'd like to thank everyone for your prayers and support to make this sabbatical possible and helping me to stretch and grow. Over time, I hope to try to share more input and experiences from these months.

## **Divine Mercy Sunday, April 8**

On the Sunday after Easter the entire Church is called to gather throughout the world to celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. St. John Paul II established Divine Mercy Sunday as a feast day when he canonized St. Faustina Kowalska in the year 2000. In her diary, Divine Mercy in My Soul, she shares her experiences with the Lord as He reveals to her the message, painted image, novena, and chaplet of Divine Mercy.

This day is for us to remember to turn to God's mercy with trust, allow ourselves to receive His mercy, and share His mercy with others.

Begin to prepare for this feast day by reading some of St. Faustina's Diary or other books about Divine Mercy, learn & pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, and/or pray the novena to Divine Mercy from Good Friday through the Saturday prior to the feastday. Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation for Divine Mercy Sunday and receive Holy Communion in the state of grace on that day. On that Sunday take time to gaze at the Image of Divine Mercy and allow Him to look at you.
