FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

This weekend we celebrate the Immaculate Heart of Mary, our parish patroness and her feast. This is a great time to reflect on Mary, the love God showers on us through her Immaculate Heart, and how we can deepen our relationship with God through our Blessed Mother.

The scriptural roots are in Luke Chapter 2. “His mother kept all these things in her heart.” (2:51). Earlier (2:35) Luke recounts the prophecy of Simeon that her heart would be pierced.”

Although St. Bonaventure had referred to the Heart of Jesus and the Heart of Mary in the 13th century, the joint devotion to the hearts of Jesus and Mary was initiated by St. John Eudes who established the Society of the Heart of the Mother Most Admirable. He began his devotional teaching with the Heart of Mary, then extended to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.


In 1830, Mary appeared to St. Catherine Labouré and gave her the Miraculous Medal. Elsewhere in the bulletin is an account of that appearance and the two sides of the medal. The second side includes the images of both the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Dr. David Ricoh was one of the faculty when I was on sabbatical. He has a great devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. He writes about the four important elements all religious have in common: belief, morality, ritual and devotion. Each of the four is meant to be experiential and each applied to the devotions to the Sacred Heart and Immaculate Heart. That is, we believe in the promise of God (God is love and wants to share that love and for us to love). We act with moral rectitude, with virtue, generous love and compassion. We work for justice—not just our own personally ethical behavior. Third, we engage in rituals/sacraments that unifies us with Christ and grants us access to special graces. Rituals make it possible for us to feel the transcendent, which helps us build our faith. Finally, devotion, entering into a personal devotedness, helps us to know God in a personal way and experience a living relationship with God.

Importantly, this is not simply focused on gaining personal merit for ourselves, but to bring the loving kindness of Jesus and Mary, through their hearts, to all our human relationships. Ricoh affirms devotion, like salvation, is personal and has a communal element. In other words, through these devotions and growing our personal relationship with God, we also work at growing our love with one another.

May our feast day of our patroness, Mary’s Immaculate Heart, help us to deepen our love for God and one another.

Our Lady of the Mountain Needs

People often ask me what are the needs of Our Lady of the Mountains (OLM). Recently they gave me a list of needs. You can drop these items off at the parish office or contact Judy O'Brien, 513-474-1313 and I will pick up. Needs are blankets and sheets for queen or full size beds, towels and wash clothes. Men's pants in sizes 32–36 waist by 29–32 in length, men's t shirts, women's pants in size 10–14 and shirts medium. For both men and women they need work pants or jeans, no dress clothes please. They can use children's summer clothes—shorts, t shirts. They do not have storage room for other clothing so any items not listed will be given to St. Vincent de Paul.

Other items are items that can't be purchased with food stamps like laundry detergent, shampoo, deodorant, toilet paper, soap, tooth paste or tooth brushes. They can also always use nonperishable food for their food pantry but please don't give to OLM items you would ordinarily give to the parish food drive. Local people need it also. For the parish they need an under cabinet can opener and a three step-stepstool to reach higher shelves.

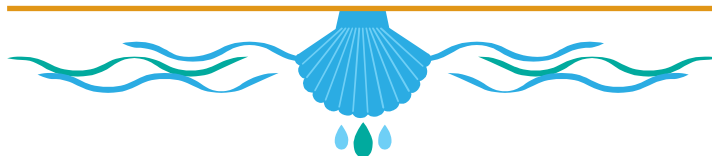

A Mother's Gift to Her Children

The Miraculous Medal is Our Blessed Mother's Gift to Us All

During the apparitions in the chapel on Rue Du Bac in Paris in 1830, Our Blessed Mother presented the Miraculous Medal to St. Catherine Laboure: "Everyone who wears it, when it is blessed, will receive great graces especially if they wear it around the neck. Graces will be abundant for those who wear it with confidence." St. Catherine saw an oval medal. On the front, Our Lady's arms are extended with rays of light issuing forth, symbolizing the graces she showers on the faithful. At the same time, she crushes the head of the serpent with her virginal feet. Around the edge is the prayer: "O Mary conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee."

On the other side, the letter "M" stands for Mary and Mother and is surmounted with a cross. Below are the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. Encircling the whole are twelve stars that remind us of Revelation 12:1, "A woman clothed with the sun, and the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars."



Great Graces and Miracles

At the time of St. Catherine's death in 1876, the distribution of the medal had surpassed the one billion mark. The innumerable conversions, cures, and cases of extraordinary protection, quickly led to its being called the "Miraculous Medal". Throughout the world, the medal is still drawing down from God blessings for body and soul. When we wear the medal, it is a symbol that shows our love for our Mother and that we are her children.

St. Teresa of Calcutta

Taking a Miraculous Medal in her fingers, Mother Teresa would often ask the sick person, "Where does it hurt?" then she would gently press the medal on that spot. "Let Our Lady kiss where it hurts." Then she would tell the sick person, "Repeat after me: 'Mary Mother, be a mother to me NOW'" and repeat the phrase, as she caressed the sick with Our Lady's medal. For Mother Teresa, this was a "medal of charity"—a sign of God's single interest in each and every person at each and every moment "now" of life.

As You Wear Your Medal, Pray:

Virgin Mother of God, Mary Immaculate, we unite ourselves to you under your title of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal. May this medal be for each one of us a sure sign of your motherly affection for us and a constant reminder of our filial duties towards you. While wearing it, may we be blessed by your loving protection and preserved in the grace of your Son. Most powerful Virgin, Mother of our Savior, keep us close to you every moment of our lives so that, like you, we may live and act according to the teaching and example of your Son. Obtain for us, your children, the grace of a happy death so that, in union with you, we may enjoy the happiness of heaven forever. Amen.

O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to you.
