Dear Friends,

This weekend at the 9:30 Mass we will be recognizing and commissioning our great catechists. Think of the many, many areas that members of our parish participate in this ministry. While the first that come to mind for many of us are teachers, our school teachers and PRP, there are so many others that enter into this important work, who all share the faith.

There are those involved in RCIA, the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults, and the RCIC, the Rite of Christian Initiation for Children. 
