How shall I make a return to the Lord for all the good he has done for me? —Psalm 116: 12



Fr. Jeff's Journey with our Blessed Mother

As my relationship with our Blessed Mother was becoming tangible and foundational to my spiritual life, I heard the story about Our Lady of Guadalupe's Tilma. This apparition was a tipping point for me in making my Marian devotion more intentional. I was moved by the active role that Mary is still playing in history and our lives.

The cactus fiber Tilma is a miraculous image. The colors are essentially hovering on the fibers. The stars reflect the constellations of the Mexican sky, but as if looking down at them from the heavens. It has survived several fires and bombings. And, most importantly, it inspired at least 5 million conversions. This image taught a people that human sacrifice to vengeful gods isn't necessary. There is a God who is love—a God who sacrificed Himself for us! And this image depicts His tender mother! How can we not be moved by her compassionate, tender, motherly, and Immaculate Heart as seen through Our Lady of Guadalupe?
